## Obituary Meipelsperger p. 1

John Meipelsperger died at St. Mary's hospital Mar. 10, 1924, aged 59 yrs. 1 mo. 12 da. He was taken suddenly ill on Feb. 24 and taken to the hospital, where a minor operation was immediately performed. After two weeks treatment the doctors pronounced him in good condition and performed the major operation on March 5th, apparently successful. On March 9th he was reported by the doctors as coming fine, and the morning of March 10th the report came that he was very low and death occurred soon after.

Mr. Meipelsperger was born Jan. 28, 1865 at Kentergrafenried, Waldmuenchen, Bavaria, Germany, and came to America with his ~~poor~~ parents at the age of 7 yrs. At the age of 24, he was united by Rev. Stephen Duren in Holy bonds of matrimony with Margaret

Hutter at Plain, on Sept. 12, 1888.  
This union was blessed with  
nine children, Mrs. Joseph Brick,  
Mrs. John Heidner, Vincent, Christ,  
John, Clemens, Christine, Celia,  
and Tony, all of St. Luke's  
Congregation, Plain.

Mr. & Mrs. Meipelsperger settled  
on his father's farm in 1888,  
where all these years they  
lived and labored amid  
the trials and hardships  
which the life of early  
settlers presented. As a result  
of his constancy, perseverance  
and hard labor he became a  
prosperous and enterprising farmer.

John Meipelsperger was highly  
respected by all who knew him,  
a selfmade man with a high  
strong character, strong individuality  
remarkable foresight, shrewd

business abilities, yet always aimed to give a square deal. He had a cheerful, happy disposition and was gifted with a pleasant touch of simple humor that cheered and brightened his surroundings and brought joy and sunshine into the hearts of his associates. Having been ever thoughtful of the welfare of those dear to him, his presence will be sadly missed, especially by his family circle. He is gone, but not forgotten dead, but lives in our memory still.

Funeral services were held at St. Luke's Chapel Wed. Mar 12, 1924 at 10 o'clock with solemn requiem high mass celebrated by Rev. Paul Monarski assisted by Rev. J. B. Brudermann of

Spring Green, who conducted the services at the cemetery. He was laid at rest amid the tears of his family & friends & a large escort of Holy Name Men, of which he was an active member.
