

DANIEL L. BRICKL

DANIEL L. BRICKL WAS BORN JULY 20, 1822 IN WALDMEUNCHEN, BAVARIA. HE MARRIED MARIA ROCKINGER IN BAVARIA. THEIR MARRIAGE DATE COULD NOT BE FOUND. MARIA WAS THE DAUGHTER OF A DOCTOR. THEY HAD SIX CHILDREN - THE NAMES ACCORDING TO A LIST FROM BAVARIA ARE: KATHERINE TERESA, BORN JUNE 28, 1852; ANNA MARIA FRANZISKA, BORN DECEMBER 4, 1853; ALOIS GEORG, BORN MARCH 21, 1857; ANNA TERESA, BORN SEPTEMBER 23, 1859 (ANNA BRICKL BLAU); MARGARETHA TERESA, BORN JANUARY 4, 1862.

DANIEL BRICKL AND MARIA ROCKINGER BRICKL'S CHILDREN AS GIVEN BY MRS. ANNA BRICKL BREY - TERESA, MARY, ALOIS, DANIEL JR., ANNA AND MARGARET.

AMONG THE CHILDREN LISTED WHO CAME TO THE UNITED STATES, WAS A SEVENTH CHILD, A JOSEPH BRICKL. IT SEEMS NO ONE KNEW HIM OR HEARD OF HIM OTHER THAN THE LISTING. (DANIEL, KATHARINE AND THE ENTIRE BRICKL FAMILY IMMIGRATED TO AMERICA IN APRIL 1872)

THE NAME "BRICKL" WAS FORMERLY SPELLED "BRÜCKL" MEANING LITTLE BRIDGE. THE SPELLING WAS CHANGED IN THE EARLY 1900'S, BUT WAS NOT LEGALIZED UNTIL AROUND 1930.

MARIA ROCKINGER WAS BORN IN APPROXIMATELY 1820. SHE DIED AT 44 YEARS OF AGE ON MARCH 14, 1864. AFTER HER DEATH, DANIEL MARRIED A VERY INFLUENTIAL FARMER'S DAUGHTER NAMED KATHARINE ROETZER. (THE ROETZERS ARE STILL LIVING ON THE FARM THAT KATHARINE GREW UP ON IN BAVARIA) DANIEL AND KATHARINE HAD ONE CHILD NAMED SIMON BRICKL.

DANIEL BRICKL OWNED A BREWERY, GAUSHAUS, BOWLING ALLEY AND VINEYARD. THE GAUSHAUS SERVED FOOD AND DRINKS BUT DID NOT HAVE A BAR.

LISTED BELOW ARE THE BRICKL CHILDREN, SPOUSES AND CHILDREN:

ALOIS BRICKL MARRIED JUSTINE BINDL. THEY HAD SIX CHILDREN. THE NAMES OF THEIR CHILDREN ARE: MARY (ALOIS WEISS), DORA (HERMAN LIEGEL), JOSEPH (ROSINA MEIXELSPERGER), ANTHONY (ANNA LINS), ROSE (JOE LAUBMEIER) AND KATHERINE.

DANIEL BRICKL MARRIED MARY BLAU. THEY ADOPTED ELIZABETH CAVANAUGH AND FRANK BLAU. ELIZABETH MARRIED PHILIP BETTINGER. FRANK BLAU MARRIED ROSINA RUHLAND. AFTER DANIEL'S DEATH, MARY MARRIED JOHN L. RUHLAND. AFTER JOHN'S DEATH, SHE MARRIED GEORGE BREY. SHE HELPED RAISE GEORGE'S FIVE CHILDREN AND TOOK IN MARIE WELSH. THE NAMES OF THE BREY CHILDREN ARE: GEORGE, ARTHUR, ISADORE, EULALIA AND MARIE.

TERESA BRICKL MARRIED JOSEPH NACHREINER. THEIR CHILDREN WERE: JOSEPH (MARY BETTINGER), ALBERT (MARY MAGLI), RUDOLPH (ROSILLA HEISER), TILLIE (JOE BREI), LYDIA (GEORGE ALT), MARGARET (BILL RING).

MARGARET BRICKL MARRIED JOSEPH BINDL. THEY HAD FIVE CHILDREN - ALOIS (CLARA LINS), MARGARET (GEORGE KREUL), ANNA AND MARY WHO WERE NUNS AND TECKLA.

ANNA BRICKL MARRIED JOSEPH BLAU. THEY HAD SIX CHILDREN - JOSEPH (CATHERINE ALT), CATHERINE (GEORGE BREY), SIMON (WHO DIED OVERSEAS DURING WORLD WAR I), ANNIE (WHO DIED FROM AN APPENDECTOMY), FRANK (ROSINA RUHLAND), ANNA BRICKL BLAU DIED FROM A HEMORRHAGE AFTER THE BIRTH OF A STILLBORN SON.

MARY BRICKL MARRIED MIKE RIEDER. THEY MOVED TO ARKANSAS. THEIR DAUGHTER ANNA MARRIED JOE BERGMAN.

SIMON BRICKL MARRIED BARBARA BLAU. (SIMON WAS SIX YEARS OLD WHEN HE CAME TO AMERICA.) THEY HAD NINE CHILDREN - MARGARET (MAGGIE), JOHN, HERMAN, MICHAEL, DAN, FRANK, ANASTASIA, AGATHA AND MARY.

DANIEL L. BRICKL AND HIS BROTHER (OR STEPBROTHER) JOSEPH WERE SMUGGLERS. AT THE TIME THEY WERE LIVING, THERE WAS A DUTY TO BE PAID ON GOODS BETWEEN CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND BAYERN (BAVARIA). DANIEL LIVED IN WALDMEUNCHEN, WHICH IS ABOUT SIX MILES FROM THE CZECHOSLOVAKIAN BORDER. HE SMUGGLED A LOT OF THINGS, ESPECIALLY ANIMALS. MANY OF THE ANIMALS WERE HORSES AND DOGS. AT ONE TIME HE WAS MUGGED. IT IS NOT CLEAR WHETHER HE WAS ROBBED OF ALL OF HIS ANIMALS AT THE BORDER OR IF HE HAD SOLD HIS MERCHANDISE AND WAS ROBBED OF HIS MONEY. AT ANY RATE A LARGE SUM OF MONEY WAS INVOLVED. FOLLOWING THIS EPISODE, DANIEL BECAME FEARFUL AND NO LONGER WANTED TO SMUGGLE.

AFTER THIS TRAUMATIC EXPERIENCE, HE LITERALLY SOLD EVERYTHING. AT KATHARINE'S INSISTENCE, THEY HAD AN AUCTION AND SOLD ALL OF HIS PROPERTY. THEN THE ENTIRE FAMILY IMMIGRATED TO AMERICA.

IN WALDMEUNCHEN, DANIEL HAD A HOUSE CALLED THE BRICKL KELLER. HERE PEOPLE WOULD MEET ON SUNDAYS AND HOLY DAYS. NEAR THE KELLER WAS AN UNDERGROUND PLACE WHERE BEER WAS STORED AND KEPT COOL. THERE WERE TABLES AND CHAIRS AND EVERYONE SAT AROUND, TALKED AND DRANK BEER. DANIEL BRICKL WAS NOT IN GOOD STANDING WITH THE CATHOLIC CHURCH. THE BRICKL KELLER STILL EXISTS TODAY (1986) BUT IS NOT USED MUCH.

DANIEL PURCHASED A FARM IN PLAIN, WISCONSIN, WHERE HE FARMED WITH HIS FAMILY UNTIL HIS DEATH.

ON AUGUST 15, 1887, FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION, DANIEL AND HIS FAMILY WERE ON THEIR WAY TO CHURCH. THEY WERE RIDING IN THEIR SURREY, DRAWN BY TWO HORSES. THE ROADS WERE MUDDY AND RAIN WAS POURING DOWN. SOMEONE RIDING A LONE HORSE ACCIDENTLY SPOOKED DANIEL'S HORSES AND THEY RAN AWAY. DANIEL WAS THE ONLY ONE HURT AND HE WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED. HIS CONDITION BECAME PROGRESSIVELY WORSE. DANIEL DIED AUGUST 20, 1887, FIVE DAYS AFTER THE ACCIDENT.

(FOR QUITE SOME TIME BEFORE HIS ACCIDENT, DANIEL HAD A STRONG AVERSION FOR A CERTAIN PERSON - THEY WERE NOT COMMUNICATING. THIS PERSON CAME TO SEE HIM ON HIS DEATH-BED AND THEY BECAME RECONCILED.)

SOME TIME AFTER THE DEATH OF HER HUSBAND, KATHARINE MARRIED JOSEPH DRESEN. THEY LIVED IN SAUK CITY, WISCONSIN. SHE DIED FROM BREAST CANCER AND WAS BURIED IN ST. ALOYSIUS CEMETARY, SAUK CITY, WISCONSIN.
